Membership Information and Application

The Maryland Green Building Council (MGBC) is the state’s first residential green building program to certify local builders, remodelers and developers using the ANSI certified National Green Building Standard. Membership Requirements

Individual / Employee Participation

Council Delegate:

1. Be an employee of a member of HBAM
2. Pay annual \$100 MGBC dues
3. Complete one HBAM sponsored or MGBC Board approved green education program

Company Participation

Certified Associate Member:

1. Designate one Council Delegate as the Corporate Designated Certified Officer.
2. Corporate Designated Certified Officer will complete the 1 day "Introduction to Green Building" seminar sponsored by the Home Builders Association of Maryland. This will be offered once each quarter through December 2010 and semi-annually thereafter

Certified Builder/ Remodeler/ Developer Member:

1. Meet the Certified Associate requirements
2. Corporate Designated Certified Officer will complete the 1 day "Introduction to the National Green Building Standard" seminar sponsored by the Home Builders Association of Maryland. This seminar will be offered the day after the "Introduction to Green Building" seminar.
3. Complete at least one ANSI or ANSI equivalent certified project annually

Companies must select one employee to be the Designated Certified Officer who must complete the certified membership requirements. All other employees to join the MGBC will be a Council Delegate until certified membership requirements are met.

Education

The Maryland Green Building Council will provide a wide range of green building courses covering the ANSI certified National Green Building Standard. Education courses will cover all things "green" from developing, marketing and selling your green homes and products to energy star for homes, water efficiency, sustainable site design, "green" remodeling projects, rater/verifier training, HVAC systems and more.

Education courses will be taught by qualified professionals and will include field tours and demonstrations. Courses are open to non-Council members, elected officials and anyone interested in "green" building practices, however, due to space restrictions, priority access will be given to MGBC Members..

Credits earned through education can be applied to CMBR continuing education. Any NAHB courses attended can be applied as continuing education towards an NAHB designation.
